## When You Want to Know:

- where a person lives.
- what his occupation is.
- who lives at a certain number on a street.
- where a street is located.
- the correct spelling of a name.
- the officers of a corporation.
- the partners in a firm.
- the solution to any of scores of problems that pop up unexpectedly to annoy and baffle you.
- you can quickly find the answer in the City Directory.**

## U. S. Census vs. City Directories

Both are useful for placing people in a particular place at a particular time.

-----

**U. S. Census** was only taken every 10 years beginning in 1790 to present. 1790-1840, only the head of the household was listed by name.

Starting in 1850, every person in the household, including children, were listed with age and occupation.

Other pertinent information was listed based on the census year.

-----

**U. S. City Directories** were published about every two years, most beginning by the mid-1800's. Alphabetically listed by surname, every working adult in the household was listed by name, occupation, and address. A non-working wife's name was listed in parentheses or italics following the husband's name. Sometimes a business address was also included.

Very few errors; surnames and variant spellings are listed. You can quickly see everyone with that surname in that locality. If a "Street Directory" is included, you can easily find the names of every neighbor on that street.

They can also lead you to nearby churches, cemeteries, and municipalities, where you can look for more records created while your ancestor lived in this location.

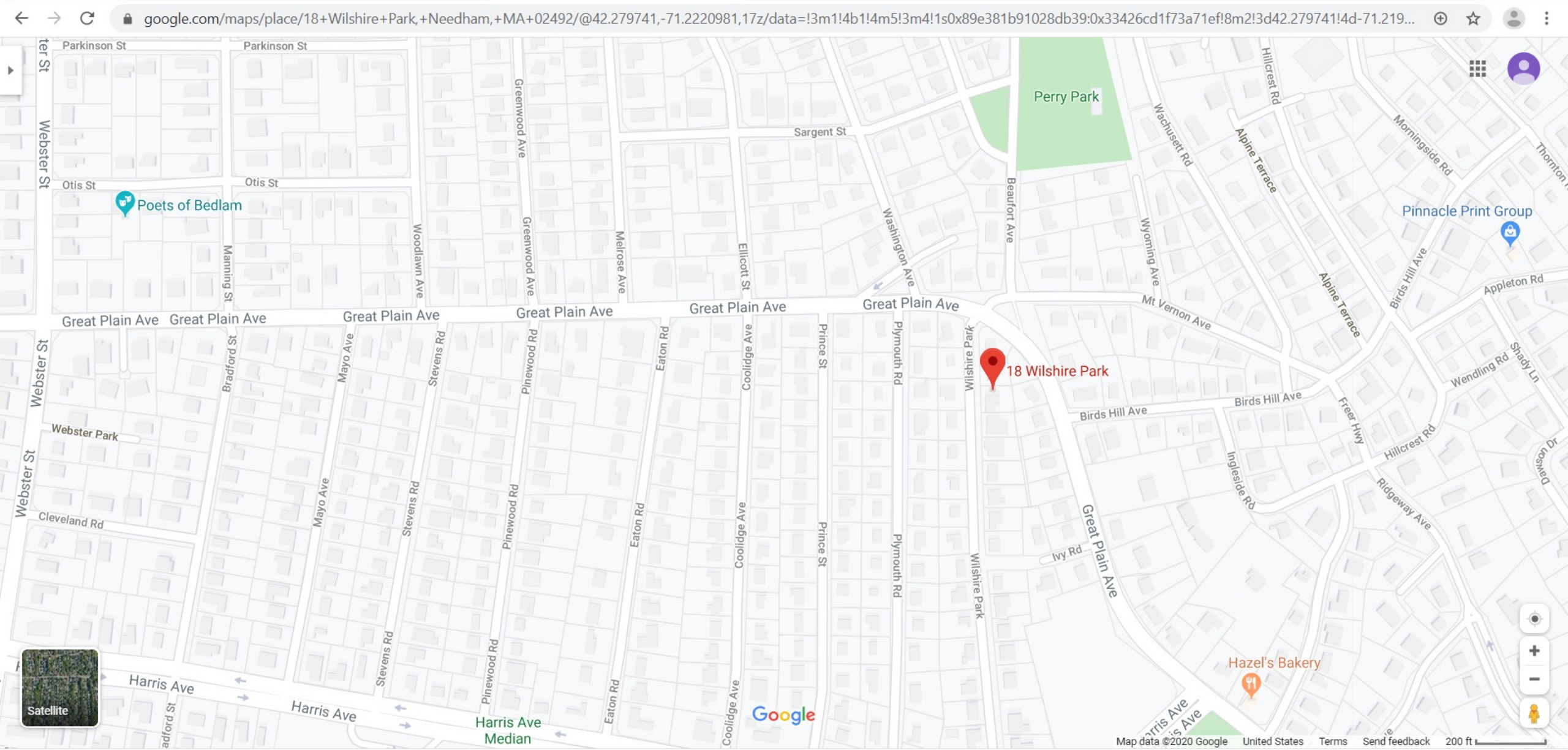

# What all can you find in city and county directories?

## 1. Your ancestors and family members:

.Residences, occupations, every adult in their household.

.People with the same surname in the same location, or different spellings!

.Deaths (i.e., woman is now listed as “widow of”).

.Note any abbreviations used: i.e. - “r” for resident, “h” for householder

**TO DO:** Track them on every available directory in their adult life span, to note any changes, just like you would do for every census year.

This, for some cause, did not prove to be in accordance with his design, and he subsequently built another one at the corner of Market square and east High street, which, because of its dimensions and the simplicity of the times, was described as a great castle. This building still remains; originally, it was built with Dutch tiles in the fire places, with an antique pulpit in the salon. The walls of this department were decorated with a fine, but apparently coarse kind of German canvas tapestry, interwoven with beautiful designs of German hunting scenes, forests, men on horse-back, dogs, falcon, etc. This tapestry was over one hundred years hanging on these walls, and when taken down, about two years ago, was still in an excellent state of preservation. Baron Steigel laid out the town, and was, in turn, an iron master, glass manufacturer, preacher, and teacher, and died in the latter capacity very poor. On December 24, 1774, a special act was passed for his relief. For a number of years he had been manager of the Elizabeth Iron Works; a stove manufactured at these works was recently sold, which was known to be over one hundred years old. The glass works, of which he was in part proprietor, were located on the corner of Charlotte and Steigel streets, opposite the hardware store of Mr. A. Kline. Mr. J. M. Ensminger, proprietor of the Manheim Sentinel, has in his possession a striped glass powder-horn, a blue glass ball, and a fancy striped salt-cellar manufactured by Baron Steigel, over a hundred years ago.

Mr. J. M. Hahn, cigar manufacturer, has a remarkably fine violin bearing the following inscription: Galpard Duffo Pruzzard Bonaeciclic Amic 1516, Italy. He has also a latin book published in Germany in 1518.

The southern part of the town seems to have been one vast Indian burying ground, several skulls, bones, etc., having been exhumed at different times. In 1762 Manheim contained but three houses. The first of which, on South Prussian street above Ferdinand, is still standing, presenting a respectable and habitable appearance. The third house in the town was erected by Andrew Bartruff, of whom J. R. Bartruff, carriage manufacturer, Lancaster, Pa., is a descendant. All the industrial interests of Manheim are of the most solid and substantial character, the manufacture of cigars, perhaps, predominating. The inhabitants are frank, enterprising, and remarkably hospitable. There is one bank, several fine churches, a commodious school building, planing mill, flour mills, foundry, and one enterprising newspaper. Population 1,500. . Lancaster City currently: 1843 – 1960 (but not every year!) is available on Ancestry. Some years also have directories for Lancaster County Boroughs (i.e. 1890 Directory has Adamstown, Columbia, Elizabethtown, Lititz, Manheim, Marietta, Mount Joy, Strasburg, Washington); and some years have listings for Lancaster County Townships. Lancaster County currently: 1869 & 1890.

. Clicking on the year of a directory in the search bar will give you a drop-down menu of all directories for that town available on Ancestry. Likewise, clicking on the state or county, will give you access to any state, any county, or any municipality that they have, and you can see what's available.

. Look for actual copies of the original directories in local historical societies and libraries. Some areas have an 1890 City or County Directory which is helpful in locating your ancestors where the 1890 US Census is gone! Lancaster History Collection – listing available on LH.org website. There is also a 1914 Farmers Directory.

. Lots of small towns printed their own directories.

. Look for college alumni directories, old telephone directories, Women's Clubs directories, school yearbooks (Ancestry has 1900-1999), farmers' directories, and ethnic directories for big cities like Chicago at [FamilySearch.org](https://www.familysearch.org) –"Search" – "**Books**" in their Digital Library.

. European directories started in the 1600's. [Ancestry](https://www.ancestry.com) has some directories for Canada, Australia, Europe, and even one for Mexico. Their UK collection has directories from the 1600's to the 1900's. There is also a collection of British phone books from 1880-1984, and items such as a seven volume set of the "Directory of Scottish Settlers in North America 1625-1825".

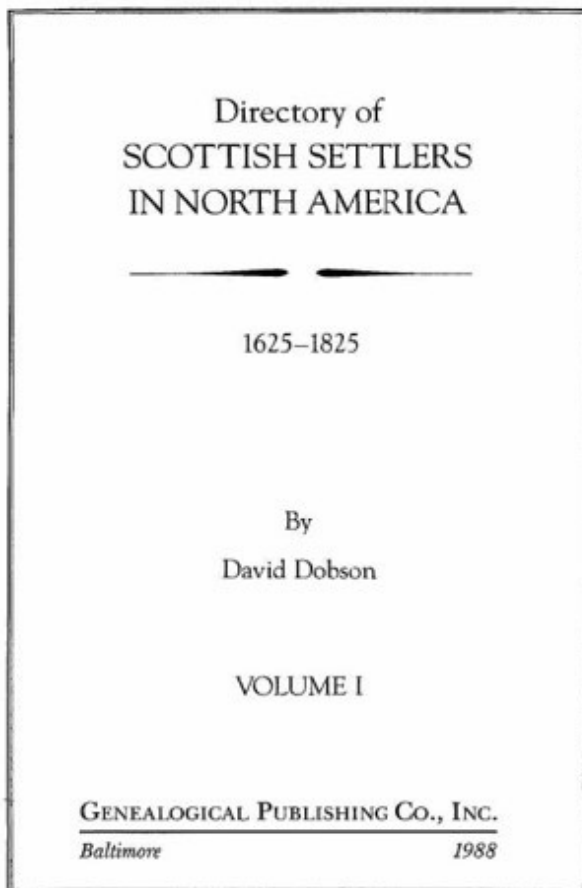
